

SEL CORNER (SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING)

Dear EDUPRIZE families,

Today's SEL tip about "Resetting Your Body" comes from one of our lovely and talented first grade teachers, Ms. Powell:

When we experience strong emotions, our body responds. Certain practices, such as breathing exercises or stretching routines, can help children increase **self-awareness** and **self-management** of their emotional responses. There are many breathing and

stretching exercises that guide children and help them visualize their practice. You may choose to do such breathing or stretching exercises at scheduled time of the day (perhaps before bedtime or as a daily break from homework). You may also choose to use these practices when at moments you and your child feel it could be helpful.

Try some of these prompts as you and your child navigate good times to reset your bodies:


- I notice you seem (upset, distracted, tired, experiencing strong emotions...). Would you like to do a breathing exercise with me?
- It's been a long day. Why don't we get our bodies and minds ready for bed with some stretches.
- I think we can focus on this better after we reset our bodies. Would you prefer to focus on our breathing or stretching?

Health Office Updates



IMPORTANT HEALTH OFFICE INFORMATION

As illness or health situations occur throughout the school year, it may be necessary for medication to be administered at school. All prescribed AND over the counter medication (i.e. Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Benadryl, etc.) will need to be checked into the Health Office, along with a <u>Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent</u> form which requires a doctor's signature. These forms can be found on our website <u>www.eduprizeschools.net</u> under the Parent & Student Resources>Health Office Forms, or you can just click on any of the links provided in light blue.

- <u>HEALTH ACTION PLAN</u>: Please be aware that children who have asthma, diabetes, or seizures will need an action plan provided by their health care provider, ALONG with the signed <u>Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent</u> form.
- <u>ASTHMA</u>: If your child has asthma, an asthma action plan will need to be provided by your doctor ALONG with a signed <u>Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent</u> form.
- <u>ALLERGIES</u>: Allergies that require an EpiPen will need an <u>Anaphylaxis Management Packet</u> filled out and signed by a doctor along with the <u>Prescription and Non-prescription</u>
 <u>Medication Consent</u> form .
- MEDICATION: As a reminder, ALL medications need to be checked in at the Health Office.
 Students are not allowed to carry any medication in their backpack unless the parent and Dr have signed a self carry medication consent in addition to the medication consent form.
 A <u>Prescription and Non-prescription Medication Consent</u> form will also need to be filled out for any medications, prescription or non prescription.

We cannot accept ANY medications without these forms.
